GRACE ASSEMBLY – A Missional Family Church

INTRODUCTION

Let me share the second part of the Missional Family Church. It is all about loving God and loving people. The key word is love. Therefore, as a Missional Family Church, we are called to:

I. LOVE FATHER GOD

- Beholding Our Father Loving Father is the upward focus. What does it mean to love God?

Matthew 22:37-38 NIV

Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment."

The Greek word for 'love' used in this first commandment is the verb 'agapao'. To 'agapao' something means to totally give ourselves over to something, to be totally consumed with it, or to be totally committed to it. What we 'agapao' is what we put first in our lives. All our intentions and abilities are focused and consumed with this one thing. In other words, 'agapao' is a commitment or a binding of ourselves to something.

When we 'agapao' something, we are submitting our wills and our lives to it. In other words, it's the ultimate commitment of ourselves, it's what we put first in our lives. So to 'agapao' God is to give Him first place in our lives.

II. LOVE FAMILY

- Building Our Family

Loving family is the inward focus.

Family here denotes both the spiritual family and physical family.

'We want to be a church that is friendly, warm, closely connected, and demonstrating the love of God towards one another'.

III. LOVE FRIENDS

- Blessing Our Friends

Loving friends is the outward focus.

Friends here represent all your pre-Christian friends, acquaintances, people in our community.

God places a high premium on souls. It costs His only Son. We are called to reach out to others so they may come to know Jesus and experience the love of the Father.

> 'The emphasis is not about bringing the world into the church, but bringing the church into the world'.

> The church must focus on the one thing that matters, and that one thing is the souls of men and women. We cannot be busy with many things and not focusing on the one thing that matters. We can be running a lot of programs and events but if we are not winning souls, we have failed in our mission.

> That's why the word 'missional' is so important. 'Missional' is a lifestyle where we intentionally live out the gospel wherever we are.

CONCLUSION

A Missional Family Church lives out the church's three dimensional calling:

- to be upwardly focused on God in worship that is passionate;
- to be inwardly focused on the family that is demonstrated in relationships of love;
- to be outwardly focused on a world that does not yet know God.

I pray you begin to understand why Grace is a Missional Family Church.

Maybe not. Despite being the youngest, my team gave me the opportunity to preach a short message to a Christian International School. The outline came to my mind only on the night before my trip. Over the next few days, I started my research and went through a lot of thinking, not 'feeling' a very personal touch from God at all. After I delivered the message, the teachers in the Christian International School affirmed that whatever that was preached was aligned to their curriculum that semester! When I heard it, I was amazed by God's doing. Even through my thought processes and research, God's hand was moving me to type out the message that He wants to deliver to the students. How amazing is our God, that even in the subtlest way, He used me to bring glory to His name!

Third blunder! I was afraid that I couldn't connect and work well with the team, as I was very new to them. But I thank God for the love that binds us together. We had an enjoyable time of serving and fellowshipping together. We laughed, joked, rushed and most importantly, we prayed and encouraged each other with the common goal of loving God.

The Church is a global church. While we manage our local ministries and are involved in local outreaches, let us not forget our fellow missionaries who are working hard in the fields who need our support and encouragement! So do sign up for a mission trips now!

This is our service as a couple to our Creator, and to the people we love. For this, we are motivated to look beyond each other's failures, selfishness, bad habits and even idiosyncrasies. We share a greater cause. Having God's big picture etched into our hearts, we are energized to love each other more, especially at times when we face challenges in our relationship.

My wife and I found our reasons for wanting to stay married to one another. We constantly remind ourselves of these reasons. We know that we want to, and will stay happily married despite challenging times ahead. We know deep in our hearts why we got married, and want to stay married to each other for life.

I urge you to dig deep and know why you want to stay married to your spouse and keep reminding yourself of this reason, so that you can be the great lovers for life.

Single Income Family – A Journey of Faith



In Singapore, with its high cost of living, living on a single income is often seen as something that is impossible to accomplish. How does a family live on a single income? Bro Albert shares...

When my first child was born, I was in the final year of my overseas university studies. We had to depend on ourselves to care for our little daughter and with the help of fellow Christians in the local church. My wife, Margaret was superb in the caring for the baby. Upon returning to Singapore, my wife

expressed her desires to be a homemaker (AKA Housewife), I have no issues with that decision, but there will definitely be financial challenges ahead - I just started my career, there is the renovation of our new 5-room flat, and many other uncertainties. But we believed that God is our Provider and will definitely help us through.

The decision we took was for the benefit of the child, so my wife can devote all her time to bonding with the child, and keeping the house neat and tidy. Being a teacher by profession, Margaret started coaching our girl early. By the age of three, Joni is able to read. Her early childhood education helps her to cope with our very stressful primary school education.

How do we cope with the financial challenges? We have to be prudent in our spending. For example, the issue of purchasing a car was contemplated many times. In the end, we decided not to buy a car. Our 5-room flat wasn't fully renovated when we moved in. Only the master bedroom and kitchen were furnished with cabinets. We have to live within our limits. The renovation of our house went through four phases over 10 years.

Being a homemaker brings about other social pressures. So many times we hear comments like "So good! No need to work ar?" and "Wah! Tai tai ar! Enjoy life hor?" I can assure you, it's not an easy task being a stay-at-home mother! Not every woman is able to face this challenge. I've had colleagues who told me that they would go mad if faced with their child the whole day. The job scope of a stay-at-home mother includes the following: Caring for the child (include educating and training), keeping the house clean, cooking meals, planning and purchasing the necessary logistics for the house, etc.

If you have a homemaker wife, do appreciate her and love her. How do we cope with the negative comments? We have to constantly remind each other to ignore such comments, and reframe our perspectives to align with what God desires us to do.

Both of our girls are currently doing very well in their respective schools. Till today, we lack nothing. We thank God for bringing us through this journey of being a single income family. We thank God for the support from our immediate families in our decision.

What's Next For Us (After The Wedding Is Over)

A wedding lasts for a day, but a marriage is for a lifetime; a lifetime full of transitions. REACH Counselling has contributed an article on ways to build a strong and healthy marriage, and the article was featured in The Wedding Times.

Couples enter into marriage dreaming of a blissful journey ahead. The excitement of a wonderful honeymoon paints a glamourous image of passion and euphoria. However, reality soon kicks in, and they come to realise how different the courtship days were, compared to the marital life they've begun. Disagreements, personality clashes, poor communication that lead to misunderstandings, conflicts and uncertainty become inevitable.

Welcome to the transitions in marriage!

It seems like the road ahead is more of an uphill one and less of a picture of bliss. Some couples chose to give up, while others persevere and trudge on. There is hope if couples are willing to work on their marriages from its early stages. All stages of marriage encompass transitions. Understanding the various transitions will help us prepare for what it means to live out your wedding vows.

Transitions in Marriage

A couple's relationship development and its stages are similar to the process of a new born baby going through his growth into early childhood. Thus, it is a journey with many stages of progression. Crossing these stages would involve the following transitions.

1. Ceremony

In most societies, the values, beliefs, norms and culture uphold the significance and sacred unity of marriage. The legal and moral binding is a joyous milestone for the couple. Couples start feeling the pressure and stress when they feel the weight of responsibilities and obligations that follow soon after. There's a change of roles – "husband", "wife" and "in-laws". Begin to envision yourselves in these different roles.

'Commitment vs Contract' is something couples struggle to process in today's culture. Some couples who are committed will stick together and adjust, while some couples may not endure this phase of commitment. The passion and excitement couples had during courtship days slowing fade away. During the days of courtship the couple return to their own destinations, but after marriage they return to the same destination – the concept of "Our Home" is inculcated into the married couple's belief system. Upholding the "We" concept is important at this early stage. However, couples need to set healthy boundaries as individuals, so that respect and acceptance for each other is cultivated. Remember, 'Love is still in the air'. Set the stage for your journey together.

2. The Honeymoon is Over

As the couple settles into life after the honeymoon, tensions may rise. Differences start to become more apparent, especially when sensitive topics such as finances and in-laws are discussed. Couples shouldn't forget that each party comes from a different family of origin, which operates on totally diverse values, beliefs, and norms (VBN). It is therefore important to respect each other's 'invisible suitcases' which contain these VBN. Couples learn to grow in intimacy and not conflict. Bring your honeymoon home! This will help couples to keep the sparks alive.

3. Just the Two of Us

Spouses often get trapped at this stage if healthy boundaries are not maintained with in-law relationships. This is when you 'leave and

cleave' – leave your parents and cleave to your spouse. The transition here involves emotional adjustment for both parties. Partners need to learn to give first preference to the other, and not put parents above their spouses. At the same time, recognise and respect the value of filial piety, which could be a strong value in some spouses.

Research has shown that unhappy couples have contemplated separation or divorce as early as the second or third year of their marriage. It is not unusual for couples to doubt their decision to get married. This is the time you'd need to stop dwelling on these thoughts, and seek professional help from a Marriage Counsellor. I call it giving your marriage a marital immunity dosage. Do not wait until it's too late, when a third party invades, or when you go separate ways.

4. The Birth of the First Child

There is instability when children enter the network of two. This is when attachment and time has to be shared, and roles change – the husband becomes a dad, and the wife becomes a mum. It's of paramount importance that you're not stuck with the new role and forget to be husband and wife. That role requires constant bonding and nurturing. Hence, do not neglect your marital bond – which is the base of your family system.

5. The Terrible Two's and Entering School

Couples who become parents split hairs on ways to discipline their kids. They generally resort to the method they were brought up with, and apply similar decisions on discipline. Some couples even want to go separate ways due to disagreements on their kids' disciplinary issues. Couples need to explore their 'invisible suitcases' with regards to discipline. The two become a bigger networking system. Once again, it's essential not to neglect to find couple time and bond as a couple. Most couples lose their roles as spouses in this process of nurturing and bringing up kids.

6. Throughout the School and Adolescent Years

Raising children is a challenging journey, especially when they are adolescents. Career changes and other responsibilities increase as your kids grow. As a family life Educator and Counsellor, I would encourage couples to attend parenting talks offered by your children's schools or specialised organisations. None of us come 'qualified' to parent our kids in the best possible way. Hence, do start learning and upgrading your parenting skills, with some modifications to suit your kids, at their different life stages. This is one way to reduce some of the stress that you may encounter as a parent.

Strengthen the Couple Bond

The objective of becoming aware of transitions is to enable you to prepare yourself and manage the stress factor that accompanies these transitions. Transitions do not stop here. They continue throughout our life journey at different stages. The secret for a healthy marriage starts at the very beginning with keeping the couple bond strong. It is a 'workin-progress' which requires both parties' commitment and hard work. Couples need to work on clear communication, and to nurture listening, intimacy and trust. Communication paves the way to transition well.

All marriages go through their 'highs and lows'. Are you both committed to weather the storms and be there for each other? *References:*
